

COOPERATIVE EUROPEAN GRAPEVINE MOTH (EGVM) QUARANTINE PROJECT
COMPLIANCE AGREEMENT for use with MASTER PERMIT QC 1269

EXHIBIT 1269 C- HAULER/TRANSPORTER: Bulk Grapes For Crush

Provisions for Intrastate Movement of Bulk Grapes for Crush Produced Inside the EGVM State Interior Quarantine Area

Establishment shall move regulated articles *within or from* the area quarantined for EGVM when complying with all of the following:

1. Only transport bulk grapes for crush from a grower* operating in accordance with Master Permit QC 1269 under compliance with the Project.
2. Ensure each shipment of bulk grapes for crush is received by a receiver* operating in accordance with Master Permit QC 1269 under compliance with the Project and/or the receiving County Agricultural Commissioner.

3. Unfermented pomace (solid remnants of grapes after pressing, which contains the skins, pulp, seeds, and stems of the fruit) is regulated as bulk grapes. Unfermented pomace not handled in a manner approved for bulk grapes should be treated as green waste.
4. Ensure the exterior of all vehicles, conveyances and equipment (bins, barrels, machinery, gondolas, etc.) is thoroughly cleaned of all host material and debris prior to leaving the growing premise for transit and prior to leaving the receiving facility.
5. All trailers, conveyances, containers, etc. of bulk grapes may be filled to no less than 4 inches (for hand harvested grapes) or no less than 12 inches (for mechanical harvested grapes) below the rim of the container if:
 - a. grapes have been harvested from a vineyard distanced 200 or more meters from the boundary of a vineyard with an EGVM detection by trapping or inspection, or distanced 500 or more meters from the boundary of a vineyard with an EGVM detection by trapping or inspection where mating disruption is used, **or**
 - b. no EGVM have been detected by trapping or inspection for the last three EGVM generations within 200 meters of the vineyard grapes are harvested from or within 500 meters of the vineyard grapes are harvested from where mating disruption is used, **or**
 - c. EGVM has been detected by trapping or inspection within the last three EGVM generations within 200 meters of the vineyard grapes are harvested from or within 500 meters of the vineyard grapes are harvested from where mating disruption is used **and**:
 - i) pre-harvest treatments are applied for first and second EGVM flight generations of the current year, **or**
 - ii) pre-harvest treatments were required and applied only during the first generation of the current year, **or**
 - iii) in a new quarantine area where the first moth detection occurred during the second generation of the current year and treatment was subsequently applied during that generation.

If none of the above circumstances apply, all trailers, conveyances, containers, etc. of bulk grapes shall be transported tightly covered (i.e. tarped, screened, covered by stacked bins, etc.) to prevent spillage of grapes during transit.

6. Bulk grapes for crush shall be IMMEDIATELY transported from the growing premises to the **receiver*** using a continuous direct route, without delay or interruption.
7. Notify the Project and **receiver*** as soon as possible, but no later than 24 hours in the event of an accident or spillage of the shipment.
8. Receiving establishments may have additional requirements for transport conditions of grapes to the facility.
9. Ensure a copy of this compliance agreement and a copy of this exhibit are inside each vehicle during transit.
10. Ensure all employees receive training to be compliant with all specifications of this compliance agreement exhibit.

Shipments found to be in violation of the above stipulations are subject to being held, rejected, destroyed, or subject to other prescribed actions at the discretion of the Project.
